Summary

The National Citizen Survey™ (The NCS™) is a collaborative effort between National Research Center, Inc. (NRC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). The survey and its administration are standardized to assure high quality research methods and directly comparable results across The NCS communities. This report discusses differences in opinion of survey respondents by household income and age.

Responses in the following tables show only the proportion of respondents giving a certain answer; for example, the percent of respondents who rated the quality of life as “excellent” or “good,” or the percent of respondents who attended a public meeting more than once a month. ANOVA and chi-square tests of significance were applied to these comparisons of survey questions. A “p-value” of 0.05 or less indicates that there is less than a 5% probability that differences observed between subgroups are due to chance; or in other words, a greater than 95% probability that the differences observed are “real.” Where differences were statistically significant, they have been shaded grey.

The margin of error for this report is generally no greater than plus or minus four percentage points around any given percent reported for the entire sample (559 completed surveys). For subgroups of responses, the margin of error increases because the sample size for the subgroup is smaller. For subgroups of approximately 100 respondents, the margin of error is plus or minus 10 percentage points.

Notable differences between demographic subgroups included the following:

- For measures related to Community Characteristics, residents aged 18-44 tended to give lower ratings to a number of aspects, particularly those rated to Mobility and general aspects. These included the overall quality of life in Cañon City, the overall image or reputation of Cañon City, traffic flow on major streets, the ease of walking and availability of paths and walking trails. Survey participants with incomes \$100,000 or more were more likely than their counterparts to give positive ratings to traffic flow, as well as the availability of affordable quality housing and cost of living in Cañon City; this same demographic tended to give lower ratings to public places where people want to spend time. Respondents aged 55 and older were more likely to positively rate the overall feeling of safety in Cañon City, the availability of affordable quality health care and opportunities to participate in social events and activities.
- Within the pillar of Governance, Cañon City residents with higher incomes (\$100,000 or more) were more likely to give favorable ratings to government services such as garbage collection, drinking water, storm drainage, sewer services, power utility and utility billing, while residents with incomes less than \$50,000 tended to give lower ratings to sewer services. Participants aged 45-54 tended to give lower ratings to economic development and traffic signal timing when compared to their counterparts. Participants aged 55 and older were more likely to positively rate a number of characteristics about the City, including the value of services for taxes paid, the job Cañon City does at welcoming citizen involvement and overall customer service, as well as police, crime prevention and traffic enforcement.
- Respondents with incomes \$100,000 or more reported higher rates of Participation for attending a City-sponsored event, campaigning for an issue or cause and volunteering their time to some group or activity in Cañon City. Participants with incomes less than \$50,000 were more likely to be under housing cost stress, and less likely to have carpooled instead of driving alone, participated in a club or to have voted in local elections. Residents aged 55 and older and residents with incomes less than \$50,000 were less likely to have used Cañon City recreation centers or their services or to report that they were in very good or excellent health when compared to their counterparts.
- Younger residents aged 18-44 were less likely to rate the overall ease of travel, overall natural and built environments and health and wellness opportunities as essential or very important community focus areas in the coming years. Residents whose incomes were \$100,000 or more were less likely to support investments in road improvements, but more likely than their counterparts to support investments in future trail developments, downtown revitalization and stormwater improvements. Participants aged 18-44 tended to indicate more support for the construction of a new fountain/splash pad at Macon Plaza than their older counterparts.
